- #1-4 An Independent Legislative Redistricting Commission will likely function best if there is a ratio of Independent and Appointees with the support of LAFOR. The Voting Rights Act cannot be violated while establishing any reforms.
- #5 I need further exploration of this issue. At present all recognized parties engage in the election process. The governance and operation functions, as does our democracy, by majority.
- #6 The signature requirements are actually quite low. It is through the challenging process that candidates meet the simple burden of witness signature requirements. Serving in elected office will have far more requirements to legislate. The petitioning process is essentially the first opportunity to validate ability and outreach.
- #8 As a member of the NAACP, this issue greatly concerns me. My district loses funding based on the current formula. Re-entry and family services programs can be implemented if reformed.
- #9 I support Election Day Registration in principle and concept. As a District Leader I also know how much additional administrative and legal background check support this will require. My district will need Federal Funding from Help America Vote. The implementation of the BMD this year is already creating challenges to educate the community without money.
- #15 The recent change in law eliminate the need for corporations to create PAC's.
- #16 The ceiling placed on City and State candidates should not be the rubric for establishing the limit for a party committee comprised of National members and donors. The trend of candidates self financing is mitigated by Party transfers. I will need more data for a position.
- #19 It will be important to define personal use specifically to develop legislation on Cll's position.
- #22 The expansion of the CoPI can be done best when (#21) reforms are implemented.
- #28 Equal allocation as a base amount is reasonable, but must also increase based on demonstrated needs and outcomes that reduce fiscal burdens on State Government long-term.
- #31 Conference committees can be used more effectively. However, they are necessary to address common issues and move legislative and budget work efficiently. I will participate in Conference and Caucuses.
- #32 Currently the use of Panels that report on Judges is effective.
- #33 Separating the major components of a project allows MWBE's and Unions to benefit 4 more from a single project.
