

Additional Comments

- 5. Allowing the administration of elections by a two party system of governance and operation ensures some fairness. The system is not perfect, but the administration of elections is extremely political by nature and any new method is likely to be infected by politics in some way. Creating a new system to administer elections provides an opportunity for those with political agendas to hijack the process without any guarantee of balance. In my opinion, the current system, while not perfect, is better than the alternatives.
- 11. The 1st Amendment provides that individuals have a constitutional right to spend money on candidates who support their views. Rightly, laws have provided a limit on how much one may spend on candidates. In my opinion, New York has reached a fair balance in regard to contribution limits and further restricting these individual rights would be antithetical to the spirit of the Constitution.
- 12. As stated previously 1st Amendment rights. The law provides that quid pro quo agreements in regard to campaign contributions are illegal and I support all efforts to see that these laws are enforced.
- 15. New York State laws treat corporations as individuals. In keeping with this tradition, I oppose redistricting separate entities from contributing to candidates whose issues they support.
- 27. In the past, some legislators have used to the member item process to improperly enrich friends and relatives. However, there may be times when such appropriations do serve the interests of the public and such distributions are appropriate. I believe that such distributions demand strict scrutiny, but I am hesitant to insist on a hard line rule on this issue.
- 28. Certain legislators may come from districts that are more in need of government funding than others. I feel that member item distributions should not be determined based solely on seniority or loyalty to the leadership. However, a hard line rule of equal member item distribution across the board to all legislators is not the most efficient way to serve New Yorkers. I wholeheartedly support greater oversight and transparency in member item distributions.
