I strongly support many of the budget reforms included in your questionnaire, in fact I was the sole elected official to testify on behalf of the plaintiffs in the Campaign for Fiscal Equity (CFE) case challenging the budgeting process for education. In addition, I endorse most of the reforms recommended in the 2007 report of the Citizens Budget Commission calling for greater transparency in legislative process; decisions that will result in long term fiscal stewardship rather than fiscal year 'balance'; closer scrutiny of public authorities revenues; and an end to 'back door' borrowing by those same public entities, asjust some of the positions I support.

Transparency in member items is equally important in terms of budget and ethics. Currently, any organization receiving member item funding from me must present receipts to the Secretary of State for how those monies were spent in order to draw down the member item funds. Many years back that was not possible, but it recent years technology and reporting have fostered this practice. This achieves accountability and

transparency.	

In terms of election reform I am a multi-sponsor of A5279B. I also endorse a number of measures to ease ballot access. In fact, I sponsor a bill to decrease the number of signatures and lessen the burdensome requirements on subscribing witnesses in congressional elections.

One additional reform I would like to see happen and one which might ease some of the above issues is to extend the term of state elected office from two years to fours years. This would eliminate the burden some legislators feel to emphasize politics or good policy and judgment. They would no longer feel as if every vote and every decision may impact on is or her next election. I know that may sound self-serving and a little idealistic but lobbyist and unions have so much more sway with legislators when they face the expense and burden of election every two years.

- 1. _To remain independent and free to make decisions that are in the best interests of my constituents and not lobbyists. My campaign finance reports should reflect that I am no one's puppet or pawn.
- 2. To continue to fight to ensure that NYS State complies with the decision in the Campaign for Fiscal Equity Case and funds education at the negotiated amounts statewide. The economic downturn has made this a difficult issue, but hopefully Race to the Top dollars will make our schools whole, in the interim.
- To continue to push for education reforms that will aid in closing the achievement gap. In my capacity as the Vice-Chair of the Education Commission of the States I continue to endorse national curriculum standards; a longer school day and community based support programs ls to address the tangential but critical issues that affect children learning, I use my position to advocate support for the National Governor's Association Commission proposal for national curricular standards.

TOP FIVE 2010 CAMPAIGN PROMISES OR GOALS

- 1. To enlist the support of CUNY or SUNY to bring a community college to the Southeast Queens communities.
- 2. To bring a full service hospital to Southeast Queens, preferably on the grounds of the former

 St. Albans Naval Hospital. In addition to the health care need for an acute care facility in this

 community it would create long term job growth, ancillary businesses and services, internships

 and volunteer activities for young people. Such an entity might also serve as the economic

 revitalization of the surrounding communities.
- 3. To continue to push for compliance with the CFE decision.
- 4. To continue to push for education reform.
- 5. To push for less burdensome compliance requirements for SBA licensing and bidding on public contracts and subcontracts.
