I support establishing by statute an Independent Legislative Redistricting Commission charged with drawing congressional and state legislative lines and removing the responsibility from the Legislature. Now, I do not feel the legislature should directly appoint the members of a districting commission because a legislature could very well appoint a member who will work in the best interest of the legislature and not the people. The districting commission should be independently appointed members. Although I believe the legislature, as representative of his/her district, should be able to submit suggestions to the members of the commission for review. However, all legislative district lines should be drawn by the independent commission without regard for protecting an incumbent or political party, mindful of the need to keep neighborhoods intact and not drawn to undermine racial, linguistic, and ethnic representation.

As for candidates to appear on the ballot, I feel there is no problem with the current signature requirements and witness signature requirements. I do feel the Board of Elections should provide more workshops on the petition process in order to fully understand the things that could invalidate a signature, a petitioning page, and/or a cover sheet. Many of the times, candidates fail to make it to the ballot due to challenges not because they failed to meet the signatures requirements. A system needs to be implemented in order to help candidates, especially new ones, overcome this hurdle.

In regards to Election Day Registration, I am undecided for two reasons. In my research, I have seen that Election Day Registration has increased voter turnouts which are very important. Second, this could open up the possibility of election fraud. For example, in the other states that have adapted Election Day Registration, people are only asked to present themselves at poll sites, provide identification, fill out voter registration forms, and sign oaths. Now, the identification may not show proof of citizenship. I believe the proof of identity is essential as well as the proof of citizenship. Voters could be asked to bring birth certificates or their naturalization cards as proof of citizenship. We need to make sure we could cover all loopholes and prevent any possibility of fraud before it's too late. I am open to discussing how we could implement an Election Day Registration, because I agree with the concept.

Overall, I support the Citizen Union's agenda on Campaign Finance Reform. We need to level the playing field for all candidates running for legislative and statewide public office. Therefore, I do support a system of public financing for state legislative and statewide races similar to where public funds are awarded on matching basis as long as contribution limits are lowered as well. There should also be restrictions on campaign contributions from registered lobbyists and those who do business with the state because their contributions may have a correlation to the business they have pending with incumbents who seek reelection.
