#### CAMPAIGN FINANCE REFORM

As a long time civic leader and activist, I am very concerned that the public has lost its trust in government and our elected officials. The existing election laws encourage payto-play, extreme influence/access of lobbyists and Pac's and a climate of corruption and distrust. Legislation must be passed to reform the state's antiquated campaign finance laws and create a public finance system that will make elections transparent and shift away from raising money and towards issues and candidates themselves. I applaud CU for its leadership and efforts hereon and I look forward to working with you in bringing reform in this area.

#### **ELECTION REFORM**

The present way NYS uses to elect our representatives is antiquated, ineffective, prone to abuse and corruption, and established a system that discourages participation. It is no mistake that our voter turnout is as low as it is. The reforms supported by CU are sound and pro-active and will open the process to encourage greater public participation and force out partisan politics, abuse, irregularities and corruption.

#### JUDICIAL REFORM

As an active trial attorney, I know first hand how ineffective and slow our court system presently is. Furthermore, the quality of those that are chosen to dispense justice must be enhanced. Judges MUST be qualified to serve via an independent non-partisan commission, prior to being elected and/or appointed. The creation of a 2-tiered system and real judicial reform are some of the steps that we should implement to modernize and reform our court and/or judicial qualification system.

## **ETHICS REFORM**

Too many elected officials abuse the trust placed in them by the electorate. My wife was a Special Prosecutor under Charles Hines in the 1980's, investigating and prosecuting corruption and/or abuse with governmental officials and/or agencies. Unfortunately, for budgetary concerns, the office was disbanded. The abolishment of this office was shortsighted and foolhardy. We must re-establish this office, whether through the Attorney General or independently, and empower them with the ability to investigate and weed out corruption to discourage abuse, prosecute wrongdoers and regain the trust of the public.

## BUDGET REFORM

I am strongly in favor of CU's suggestions in this area. The NYS budgetary process whereby 3 men in a room make all the decisions for a multibillion dollar budget must stop. The governor's budget must include the full scope of the state's financial obligations, and an independent nonpartisan budget office must be established to give real projections and not fabrications to justify the back door dealing. Furthermore, we must severely revamp the process to incorporate performance budgeting, pick a realistic fiscal year start date, and limit the governor's ability to enact appropriations and policies that are consistent with existing laws.

## ADDITIONAL REFORMS

I am strongly committed and as Chair of Community Board, actively employed a strong policy of complete transparency and day light. I further am in favor of legislation to reform the present system to create more equity between legislative members.
