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**Additional Comments:**

1-Opens the door for wealthy candidates to have a greater influence over elections, particularly in down ballot races, where there isn't as much media attention. African American and Latino voters have deep attachment to party labels.

4- In addition to registering, and reporting registration statistics, agencies should also be encouraging active participation in voting.

6- I strongly support this. The public has a tremendous lack of confidence in the Board of Elections capacity to administer elections fairly and efficiently.

7- I strongly support any measure that protects the will of the people against an override by the Mayor and Council.

12- Gives legislators greater freedom of ideas. Members should be first among equals and power at the Council should not be so centralized.

13 D- Elevating committees to the full committee level, when they may be more appropriate as subcommittees, has been a way for the Speaker to reward members for loyalty. The work of the Council as a whole is diminished by having so many committees at the full committee level. I would explore taking some committees back down to the subcommittee level, if they are not doing relevant, meaningful work. Some committees are redundant, and should be combined.

14- With a few exceptions (such as teaching university courses) I would ban outside employment for Council Members. Members receive a fulltime salary, they should be concentrating on the business of the Council fulltime.

15- If I were given a stipend, I will give it to a charity chosen by my constituents in a process similar to participatory budgeting.

16- It is inappropriate and self serving for members to authorize their own pay increases.

17- Member items fund programs that do crucial work. They should be distributed based on need, not as a means of rewarding political loyalty.

18- I am open to any ideas that create transparency and restore faith in government.

21- I am afraid this would open the door for investigation based on rumor. Investigations should be based on evidence.

22- The CCRB should be encouraged to refer cases to existing bodies with authority to prosecute.

24- These offices provide vital services to all New Yorkers and opportunities for public dialogue. Their budget shouldn't be subject to politics.

27, 28- I support this so long as the discretion of the Borough President is maintained.

As an independent, professional woman who has enjoyed distinguished careers in both the public and private sectors, I have a track record of bringing people together to tackle community problems. I have served as Director of Equal Employment Opportunity for a major corporation, have worked as a senior aide to a NYC Comptroller and a NYC Schools Chancellor, and have served my neighborhood as a District Leader and Community Board Chair. My attachment and experiences in this community are genuine, not political. I'm running because City Hall needs strong, authentic, neighborhood leadership insisting on common-sense priorities.
