

1. Legislative districts should be formed by the reformed NY Election Commission using neutral mathematic/statistic based formula, under the auspices of the NYS Office of Court Administration.

5. The Board(s) of Elections should be replaced by Election Commission(s) with commissioners being appointed by the various counties' executives, or the Governor, on the advice and consent of the relevant legislatures/Senate for 7 yr. terms. These comissioners would be subject to judicial ethics and serve individually as A.L.J.s for non-criminal/non-fraud election matters, appellate review by the respective full commissions, and commission ruling under supreme court scrutiny. Criminal or fraud election matters would originate with the Supreme Court.

7. Nothing should be able to "bump" a valid citizen's initiative. Further, any law passed by citizen's initiative or referendum should be amendable only by another citizen's initiative, referendum or a super-majority vote of the relevant legislature (subject to executive veto without override). The state constitution should be amended to provide for statewide initiatives.

32. NY's trial judges should be appointed by the executive and ratified for life by the relevant legislatures. Vacancies should occur by either resignation, legislative impeachment, felony conviction, or citizen recall by elective petition.
