My platform includes three major points that affect the 55th Assembly District:

- Unemployment and economic development: The 55<sup>th</sup> Assembly District has one of the highest unemployment rates in New York City, as well as, in the State. Economic development, also, has been on a steady decline for the last several years. Businesses that have the capacity to bring employment to the community no longer have the incentive to continue to stay in the district. I want to work with the community and government leaders to attract businesses back to Brownsville, East New York and Oceanhill, where there are people ready, willing and able to make their communities strong, vital and sustainable. The 55<sup>th</sup> Assembly District deserves the opportunity to be a thriving and successful community.
- Education and youth services: Schools in the district have been suffering for a very long time. Many of our schools lack the necessary equipment and materials needed to provide a quality education for our children. In addition, many youth programs have been canceled due to a lack of funding and resources and the services that remain are very limited. It is my goal to work with the Department of Education, community based organizations, community leaders, and local elected officials to bring funding to the neighborhoods that need it most. We need a voice in the state legislature that will advocate for the residents of the 55<sup>th</sup> Assembly District and who will fight to bring the necessary resources into the district.
- Healthcare: The 55<sup>th</sup> Assembly District is also suffering where quality healthcare is concerned. Many people do not have and cannot afford health insurance. There are very few primary healthcare facilities located in the district. Quality doctors have shied away from opening private practices because of the aforementioned, and as a result, residents are forced to go to emergency rooms for simple medical problems, i.e. the common cold or a sore throat, which has created a backlog in our hospitals and has affected the quality of our healthcare. It is a ripple effect in which only the residents of this district are those who suffer. With the help of healthcare professionals, unions and the legislature, I want to create an innovative way to deal with this situation so that the residents in the 55<sup>th</sup> Assembly District an have access to quality healthcare.
