Position Elaboration:

I thank you for the opportunity to present material to the Citizen's Union and to be considered for your support. I'd like to expand briefly on a few answers.

With regard to questions 1, 2 and 3, I support a fully Independent Legislative Redistricting Commission and will be one of the loudest voices for reform. Enabling an appointment process or proposing to use better research in the redistricting process may be an improvement from where the process is today, but it would fall significantly short of the goal of reform.

With regard to campaign finance reform, I firmly support increasing transparency and reporting requirements across-the-board. I also support lowering campaign contribution limits, but in an even-handed manner — one that limits municipal labor's ability to contribute manpower and resources in the same manner as private sector special interests. This is the reason why I stated I would oppose banning contributions from corporations, LLCs, LLPs or from PAC's set up by them. All special interests should be treated the same and the same restrictions placed on corporations should be placed on municipal unions and other interests that push for the expansion of government.

Regarding the concept of public financing, I am against it for two reasons; 1) because the state cannot afford to spend millions of dollars on politics at a time when critical services for our children and elderly are being cut; and 2) because I believe the goal of political/electoral reform is to get the money out of politics and in a quick study of the Campaign Finance Board's work for the past 20 years shows that public financing has not worked in that regard.
