#### **TOP FIVE 2013 CAMPAIGN PROMISES**

My first promise is to be an accessible representative that listens and responds to what the people need. I will have an open door policy and a readily available staff to work on both legislative as well as neighborhood issues in a timely manner. All other promises fall under that scope.

- 1. I will take great care to review the budget in order to assure that agencies are spending our tax dollars on what the community needs and what is in the taxpayer's best interest.
- 2. I will work on reallocating funds to healthcare, infrastructure development, education, and senior and youth programs. I will also work to stop taxpayer dollars from benefiting private projects, and shift the funding to necessary services.
- 3. I will advocate halting outsourcing, keeping qualified city workers on the job.
- 4. The member-item and committee chair stipend systems are flawed and reward bad governance. Discretionary funds should be allocated to each district evenly and a councilperson's vote should not be for sale.
- 5. I will call for an audit of the NYC Board of Elections and reevaluate the process by which its employees are "appointed" or hired.
