#### **Additional Comments:**

We are not going to have an effective government unless people trust their elected officials. The indictment of the sitting Council Member in the 19th District and the drumbeat of corruption scandals throughout the City and State Government make integrity the primary issue in this election. My number one priority will be to restore integrity and transparency to both District 19 and the City Council as a whole. I will establish a discretionary spending oversight board to make sure that discretionary funds are spent to benefit the public and not to enrich elected officials and their relatives. In the 19th District, this oversight board will consist of an appointee of each of the two chairs of the community boards, the chair of the budget committee of the two community boards and a representative from the Queens District Attorney's office. A majority of the board must approve any discretionary spending and the representative form the District Attorney's office will have an effective veto power. I will also sponsor legislation to require every City Council district to have discretionary funding vetted through an oversight board. I have also pledged to institute full transparency of my daily schedule so that everyone will know when I am meeting with constituents, organizations or lobbyists. As we know, public corruption almost always takes place behind closed doors and making my daily schedule available to the public will help restore faith in government. I will also fight for legislation to make it a misdemeanor when public officials and their staff members witness corruption but fail to report it.

I pledge to pursue an agenda on the City Council to make the political process more fair and open and to make our government more accountable, responsive and transparent. I look forward to working with Citizens Union to implement this agenda.

  will know when I am meeting with constituents, organizations, lobbyists or anyone else.
- 3. I will structure my district office to empower my community to organize around important issues. For example, I will use my district office to organize parents of public school children to enable them to have a meaningful voice in the governance of local schools.
- 4. I will organize my district office to reach out to veterans and to assist them with applying for government programs so that these veterans are able to access the benefits to which they are entitled.
- 5. I pledge to be a full-time member of the City Council with no outside interests.
