29. If you support the constitutional convention, what actions, if any, will you take to ensure that it takes place? If you oppose the convention, what will you do to defeat it?

While I wholeheartedly encourage reform in Albany, I do not support a Constitutional Convention in New York
State because there are major protections for workers that are guaranteed by our State Constitution. Given the
current political climate nationwide, where unions are constantly threatened, a NYS Constitutional Convention
could endanger many residents' pensions and our unions' organizing rights. I am particularly concerned about any
changes to the civil service laws that could change terms of employment for union members and other workers.
In addition to workers' rights, I am concerned that other protections enshrined in our State Constitution, from
public education to the environment, could be at risk once this process begins. Traditionally, any Constitutional
amendment may be accomplished through the State legislature for a vote on a general election ballot. I believe
the State legislature is the most appropriate for debate on the NYS Constitution this year. I will work with labor
unions and other advocates to oppose a NYS Constitutional Convention.

Last year, Citizens Union helped craft and push for the enactment of a law that placed political contribution limits and
disclosure requirements on nonprofits that are formed by, or affiliated with, elected officials, which helped prevent
some significant features of an emerging "pay-to-play" culture in New York City. Do you have any other ideas to
further limit such a culture and create a better environment where contributions, either personal or political do not
unduly influence the actions of elected officials?

We need better disclosure requirements, especially when it comes to real estate development, which is rapidly affecting my district. For each large development project, community residents and investigative journalists are now regularly looking into the political contributions of real estate developers and FOIL-ing documents to piece together the behind-the-scenes agreements between officials, nonprofits, and developers. This information should be publicly disclosed and available at all phases of the ULURP process, from the application submission to the Community Board review through the vote at the City Council.

I believe that transparency, visibility and access is the best way to restore the public's trust in the 35th District. For the past 4 years, I've had many constituents approach me because they have tried to call the current Council Member's office for issues in the district and have never gotten a response. I've heard from constituents who have sought funding for worthy projects and do not understand the criteria on which their requests were denied. I have a senior citizen neighbor on a fixed income who had an emergency boiler issue and sought help from the Council Member's district office, to no avail. The best way that I can honor the commitment of the Council's oath of office and to represent the public interest is to always be present in the community and be responsive to calls for help. I will also be communicative with our local organizations and Community Boards. Informing the community of upcoming projects at the beginning of the process and encouraging community input is something I am deeply committed to. It's what the community has been asking for all along, especially on the Bedford Union Armory project. Establishing working relationships with the community from the start is the key to restoring confidence in our district's governance. Many residents are disenchanted with the political process and believe all electeds are corrupt and will ultimately fail them. I say this is a two way street, I'm asking for your vote, but I also want you to watch me and tell me if I'm not doing what you want. If I don't listen then I want you to vote me out of office in four years, that's how this process is supposed to work. I hope that my activism will engage more people in the political process because that's how we can truly eradicate corruption in our political system.
