TOP FIVE CAMPAIGN PROMISES FROM YOUR MOST RECENT CAMPAIGN AND ACTION ON THEM

- 1. **Improve Public Transportation Services to District Residents.** Alongside a broad coalition, I fought for the return local bus service (B37) this route provides much needed access to the local hospital, and a much needed alternative to the subway which is not wheelchair accessible.
 - Brokered a deal that created commuter ferry service at the Brooklyn Army Terminal Pier when the Montague Street Tunnel closure was announced. This route again addressed the concerns of those for whom the proposed MTA alternatives were particularly difficult, due to their limited mobility.
- 2. Maintain public safety. Initiated a first-ever program of NYPD surveillance cameras in district. Worked in concert with the DA's office, and the community board to close illegal massage parlors which supported human trafficking and reduce drug dealing by pursuing the closure of a bar which also supported prostitution. Continually fought to keep firehouses open throughout the district.
- 3. Improve quality of life: recreation options for the community, access to healthy food, support for the arts, and increased access to open space. Funded numerous playgrounds, dog runs, lighting for ball fields and capital upgrades for area parks. Working closely with the Metropolitan Waterfront Alliance and local community leaders, secured initial funding for an eco-dock to the Bay Ridge pier. Collaborating with Borough President Markowitz and

Mayor Bloomberg, obtained all funding needed for the project to move ahead. It will be a recreational and educational resource to the district and the neighborhoods surrounding it.

The dock will support a wide variety of program opportunities including:

- historic and educational boat trips for summer camps and community groups
- walk up kayak events for experienced kayakers
- community events such as City of Water Day boat tours
- environmental education projects such as water quality monitoring and oyster gardening boat trips and cruises

Arrangements are also being made to have models of historic vessels stop at the dock to welcome visitors aboard.

Working in partnership with GrowNYC, introduced a second Greenmarket in the district.

- 4. **Addressed educational needs for district students.** Relieved overcrowding by directing funding to new construction, as well as expansion of several over-crowded schools. This resulted in an additional 3,000 seats in the district. Provided funding for computers as well as pedagogical tools such as smart boards.
- 5. Expanded constituent access to services. Maintain a full time office with 4 staffers focused primarily or exclusively on constituent concerns. Added Saturday hours to provide access to those who are unable to come into district office during regular weekday hours. Proactively monitor social media to discover constituent issues before my office is contacted. I have sought and hired staff and interns who are multilingual to address the diversity of the community, and to provide meaningful access to newly arrived immigrants throughout the district.

TOP FIVE 2013 CAMPAIGN PROMISES

1. Reform budget process. I would especially like to see library funding baselined. I will fight to

amend the city charter so that 2% of the budget goes to a dedicated fund supporting library

maintenance and operations.

2. Reform operations of DOE, DOT, DCA – The chancellor should be an educator. Regarding the

DOT AND DCA, I want to end the gotcha mentality inspectors should be revenue generators;

instead they should be a partner in compliance with business owners.

3. Continue to improve parks and schools within the district.

4. Continued advocacy for seniors and veterans. I would like to build on the spirit of the

Veterans liaison bill which I sponsored last year and seek low cost and no cost ways to

acknowledge the service and sacrifice of our veterans. I would seek to allow vets to use HOV

lanes, regardless of the number of people in a car.

5. Provide increased city services to maintain and improve quality of life specifically by seeking

increased police fire and sanitation head counts.
