If an officer can lie during an investigation with impunity it dishonors the service of fellow officers.³</p>
<p>23. What is your position on reinstating the zero tolerance penalty for false official statements by public officers?</p>	<p>Support/Oppose We support the NYPD as they protect District 7. At the same time we expect that officers will be truthful when issuing official statements.</p>
