TOP FIVE CAMPAIGN PROMISES FROM 2010 AND ACTION ON THEM

1. Fight for independent redistricting

Worked to enact independent redistricting and voted against the partisan, pro-incumbent

gerrymandered lines put forward by Senate Republicans

2. Stand up for affordable housing

Led the effort to extend and strengthen rent regulations, which helped millions of tenants in New York.

3. Communicate with constituents from all parts of the district on a consistent basis

Operated office hours out of all parts of the district and held dozens of public events touching every neighborhood in the 31st Senatorial District. Held extended office hours and used every possible tool to reach out to maintain open communication with constituents.

4. Support education funding for public schools

Voted "No" on the education portion of the budget in 2011 when New York City's schools were facing major funding cuts. Voted "Yes" on the 2012 portion of the education budget when funding levels improved.

5. Support for marriage equality

Voted to pass marriage equality, helping to make New York the largest state in the country to legalize same-sex marriage and extend hundreds of civil rights to New Yorkers, regardless of sexual orientation.
