1. Fight for increased funding for Early Childhood Education:

I am proud to have successfully fought year after year to restore funding for early childhood education programs both in the 33rd District and throughout the city.

2. Create more affordable housing units in our city:

I have worked diligently and successfully on requiring develops that have gone through the rezoning process to increase the percentage of affordable units to help alleviate the dire need for affordable housing throughout our city.

3. Ensure community input into the Superfund process for both the Gowanus Canal and the Newtown Creek, which are both in the 33rd District:

I am proud to have worked with community stakeholders, my colleagues in government and city, state and federal agencies to develop as open a process as possible as the Superfund designations move forward.

I and my staff have done our utmost over the past three and half years to not only be responsive to constituent needs, but also to help them individually to sometimes fight through very difficult city bureaucracy and red tape. While we have not always been successful, I believe that we have had a significant positive impact on the lives of our many constituents.

5. In 2009, I promised to develop a new housing program for senior citizens. I have not yet achieved my goal regarding this promise.

I have learned that there are many obstacles standing in the way of developing a new program for senior housing. However, the need for affordable senior housing is only increasing every day and I commit to continuing to work with a new Council and new Administration to achieve this vitally necessary goal.

TOP FIVE 2013 CAMPAIGN PROMISES

- Ensure that the Bloomberg administration's promise of establishing a park at 65 commercial street in Greenpoint is honored and funded by a new administration.
- Sure that Brooklyn Heights and Greenpoint join Boerum Hill in joining the Neighborhood Slow Zone program by DOT.
- 3. Continuing to engage in Participatory Budgeting, which was very successful this year in the 33rd District and work more effectively and efficiently in engaging the public on participating, particularly in areas with less resources and lower average income.
- 4. Work towards increasing the Council's role in negotiating the budget so that there is desperately needed increased transparency in the City budget, especially with regard to the Department of Education, which makes up approximately 28% of the City budget.
- To work with my colleagues and advocates to develop a more equitable system for discretionary funding that takes into account the needs of districts and allows for transparency for how the system is derived, implemented, and functions.
