New York City's program, which I participated in as a member of the City Council, has been a model for reducing the influence of big money on municipal elections and encouraging the participation of average working New Yorkers in their government. It should serve as a model for the state to replicate. In addition, I have been a strong supporter of efforts to liberalize the state's ballot access laws to reduce barriers to run and I am a strong supporter of further reforms to voting such as same day voter registration.

TOP FIVE CAMPAIGN PROMISES FROM 2010 AND ACTION ON THEM

- 1. Fighting for Immigrant Rights: I've led the fight in Albany, and am the prime sponsor, of the New York Dream Act which will help make college and higher education affordable for the children of undocumented immigrants here in New York.
- 2. Working to Create Jobs and Helping Small Businesses: I have championed the cause of New York's livery cab drivers, many of whom live in my Northern Manhattan district, and played a lead role in passing legislation this spring that gives livery drivers the ability to legally pick up street hails throughout the city.
- 3. Helping Struggling Working Families: I have helped lead the fight for many measures that help New Yorkers struggling in this tough economy, including: voting to raise the minimum wage in New York State, eliminating the sales tax on clothing and footwear sales of under \$110, restoring funding for the EPIC program to make prescription drugs more affordable for seniors.
- 4. Increasing Public Safety: This has long been a priority for me since my first days in elected office when I led the successful fight to bring a new police precinct to my district. Over the past two years,

I've fought to strengthen legislation to reduce gun violence, including microstamping which will give law enforcement an important new crime fighting tool, and to combat domestic violence, proudly voting for legislation that increases penalties for repeat abusers.

5. Improving Public Education: As a former teacher married to a public school principal, education will always be a top priority for me. In addition to fighting for the New York Dream Act which will expand educational opportunities for so many immigrants, I am proud that this year we passed legislation mandating kindergarten for all 5 year-olds and that we expanded support for CUNY and SUNY.

TOP FIVE 2012 CAMPAIGN PROMISES OR GOALS

- Fight for Passage of the New York Dream: a critical step in making a college education affordable for the children of undocumented immigrants in New York
- 2. Work to Strengthen Public Education in New York: we need to not only ensure that New York City schools get the funding they need and deal with overcrowding issues citywide, we need to place special emphasis on early childhood education and increasing parental involvement
- 3. Raise the Minimum Wage: it's past time that we raise the minimum wage to at least \$8.25 per hour to help struggling entry level workers make ends meet—and we should index it to inflation so that workers can keep pace with the higher cost of food, housing and goods
- 4. Strengthen New York's Gun Control Laws: we should be leading the way in reducing gun violence by requiring licenses for all handguns, rifles and shotguns; requiring background checks on ammunition sales; and implementing microstamping technology to help law enforcement fight crime.
 - 5. Passing Campaign Finance Reform: New York State desperately needs a system of public campaign financing, similar to New York City's successful model, to reduce the influence of moneyed interests on government and to encourage the involvement of average New Yorkers.
