- 1. Create a Uniform Bill of Rights for families entering the city homeless shelters and reregulate the allocation of city subsidies to private and public shelter participants.
- 2. Create with my colleagues in government an Inspector General to oversee the New York City Police Department (NYPD).
- 3. Write legislation to equip all police vehicles with interior cameras and sound recording microphone to act similarly as "Black Box" devices for airplanes to provide more transparency of an officer's state of mind while on the job.
- 4. Fully funded senior and youth centers in my district and create a Multi-Cultural Center as outlined in my 9-Point Political Platform on my website.
- 5. Finalize all union contracts and provide just retroactive pay to all union workers.
