Additional Comments:

I am running for office because I am outraged by the amount of cronyism and backroom deals that are ubiquitous in the City Council. As such, I will tirelessly work to implement numerous new regulations and transparency mechanisms into the Council. Nowhere is corruption and cronyism more rife—and detrimental—than in the (mis)use of discretionary funds.

First and foremost, the Speaker's power needs to be limited: Discretionary funds should be distributed among councilmembers in a standardized, equitable manner—and not used to leverage obedience to the Speaker.

Next, I strongly support a more transparent system of allocating discretionary funds; it is ludicrous that there is no opportunity for public review before a final decision is made.

Finally, discretionary funds should only be spent on organizations that directly benefit residents of the district that their councilmember represents. There should be a regulation enacted that requires this. Residents of my district are particularly frustrated that member item funds allocated for this district are continually spent elsewhere. The recent situation with Councilmember Recchia is a further testament to this problem.

II. CANDIDATE ACCOUNTABILITY QUESTIONNAIRE

Citizens Union is adding a new element to its evaluation of candidates running for office. As a candidate who presently does not hold elected office, CU is interested in knowing your top five campaign promises you are making to the voters during this campaign for this position.

TOP FIVE 2013 CAMPAIGN PROMISES

- 1. I will ensure that the Greenpoint Landing and 77 Commercial Street development plans include sufficient affordable housing units and budget for community infrastructure improvements, especially park space.
- 2. I will address the imminent overcrowding of Downtown Brooklyn public schools before it reaches a crisis point. I will also fight for universal access to pre-kindergarten.
- 3. I will propose and support increased transparency and accountability in the City Council's budgetary process and discretionary fund allocation. I will also support reforms in the appointment of Community Board members, such as term limits and greater transparency and community involvement in the appointment process.
- 4. I will support mandating the inclusion of LGBT history in our public school curriculum (similar to California's FAIR Education Act), which has been shown to significantly lessen the amount of bullying that LGBT students endure.
- 5. Greenpoint's public transportation system is depressingly insufficient. I will therefore strongly advocate for increased East River Ferry and G train service.
