**TOP FIVE CAMPAIGN PROMISES FROM LAST ELECTION AND ACTION ON THEM**

- 1. Education:** Securing funding in Albany for construction of elementary and middle schools to alleviate overcrowding, reduce class size and fund innovative programs that attract and maintain quality teachers.
- 2. Transportation:** Working to restructure the MTA to ensure dedicated funding streams so our subways, buses and roads do not fall into disrepair.
- 3. Environment:** Partnering with City officials to create an incentive program to help landlords retrofit boilers to newer clean-fuel model.
- 4. Make pro bono services:** Eviction intervention services to provide free legal services to tenants.
- 5. Referendum reform:** Sponsored legislation to reform the state referendum process.

2. Ensure Quality Education
3. Be a Strong Advocate of the Needs and Concerns of the Community
