1.	Focus on strengthening the middle class after 40 years of neglect (examples, wages, jobs,

2.	_Fight to end Pay to Play Politics in Albany (pass Fair Elections, stronger enforcement of campaign
	finance law, good government reforms)
3.	Hurricane Sandy Recovery (both the city and the state's response to the storm has been slow and
	inadequate. In addition recovery is just the beginning, we must be focused on long term resiliency
	and preparation)
4.	_Climate Change, Green Energy Infrastructure and Fracking (as a city of islands we must focus on
	leading the way on climate change and developing green energy infrastructure rather than
	developing more fossil fuels like natural gas that will only make the problem worse)
5.	_Infrastructure (the economic recovery has been slow and has not reached main street and middle
	class families. Studies describe New York's infrastructure as abysmal and in a horrible state of
